For Rising 3rd Graders

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Over the summer your rising 3rd grade student has been assigned Math work in IXL to bridge from 2nd to 3rd grade. Summer assignments are new to your child but they are important to continue skills practice during the break. Your child is familiar with IXL as they work in the program throughout the year in 2nd grade. One of the best things about IXL is that your child can access it from home, so you have a chance to see their progress. Your child may also use IXL to play Math and Language Arts games as well. During the school year your child will be given opportunities to practice recommended skills at home to prepare for tests as IXL aligns with our Math curriculum Sadlier Math.

To get your child started on your home computer or tablet, please follow these easy steps. You must use our URL for your child's work to be saved. I have included his/her login information.

1. Go to <https://www.ixl.com/signin/sjsnashville>
 2. Use your child's badge QR Code
or enter your child's username and password and click "sign in"
- ***When using QR Code, click-Have a Launch Card and Hold QR Code to camera
3. Go to the Learning Tab the click on Math Skills
 4. He or she will choose the 2nd grade tab. Look for the skills letter and numbers listed below. Choose a recommended skill and start practicing Math skills. Your child must earn a 75 or above for each assigned skill. Earning a 100 will give you bonus points in the first quarter of third grade math!

New Students to SJS: If you are unable to login to the St. Joseph Domain, please log into IXL as a guest. Enter the IXL math skill for 2nd grade (review for 3rd grade) and complete for 75 points or above. Please take a screenshot of the final points and email the photo to christineholcomb@stjosephnashville.org before the first day of school.

The following IXL math skills have been assigned for the Summer of 2024:

IXL L.2 Place value models up to Hundreds

IXL W.1: Add and Subtract Numbers up to 1,000

IXL W.2: Add and Subtract 3 digit numbers Vertically

IXL Z.3: Round to the nearest ten or hundred
